GENERAL NOTES & EXPLANATIONS—RE CLASS FORMATS:

R=Residential; B=Blended; V=Virtual, which includes synchronous components at a 50% ratio; O=Online, which includes no synchronous components. These designations are given for aid in scheduling; formats for each class are subject to change.

Residential-format classes meet in the classroom 1X/week for 15 weeks.

For Blended, B^a refers to the earlier weeks in the semester; B^b refers to the later weeks. Exact weeks vary with the semester.

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⁷GCSL 626 is offered as a summer course for the last time in 2026; it will then move to Fall.
