Students who are alumni and have already completed Graduate Health Fitness, either in the undergraduate or graduate programs, may take only Graduate Aerobics or Graduate Walk, and may take the same elective twice.  
 Active Duty Military Chaplains can submit their DDE or JST forms to receive credit for GHPE 715 or 725, and will enroll in GHPE 703.
