ORU's National Student Advertising Competition team won the 2nd Place Overall award at the April 20-22 American Advertising Federation regional event in Houston. Preparation for the competition begins in the fall, when teams are given a case to work on. This year, it was how to position Meta's Quest 2 virtual reality headset as essential, back-to-school technology for college students. After spending weeks conducting research and coming up with multiple strategies to do the best job of meeting the goal, teams presented their campaign plans in mid-March and made a 20-minute pitch to a judges' panel in April.

Golden Eagle basketball alumni **Josh Atkinson '04** and **Caleb Green '07** were inducted into the Tulsa Public Schools Athletics Hall of Fame on June 2. Josh was a four-time All-Conference academic selection at East Central High. At ORU (1999-04), he became the 23rd player in school history to score 1,000 points, wrapping up his ORU career with a total of 1,061 points. In high school, Caleb led Memorial High to a state title. At ORU (2003-07), he led the Golden Eagles to two NCAA Tournaments, one NIT, and three consecutive Mid-Continent Conference regular-season titles. He was a three-time All-American.
