MASTER OF DIVINITY, MASTER OF ARTS PRACTICAL THEOLOGY

- The M.Div. Modular degree is 87.5 credit hours

 - Biblical Literature
 - Theological and Historical Studies
 - Practices of Ministry

MASTER OF ARTS, PRACTICAL THEOLOGY

- · The Practical Theology degree is designed to equip students for excellence in ministry in the local church
- · It prepares persons by increasing competency and understanding in the Word of God and practices of ministry
- The M.A. Practical Theology degree is 48 credit hours
 - Students take a minimum of 10 on-campus, week-long modules
 - Up to 18 credits may be taken via Internet
 - The M.A. Practical Theology degree allows specialized focused electives
 - It provides a Biblical/Theological/Practical Ministry foundation
