SEASON OF GENEROSITY

ORU is planning to renovate the former Early Learning Center (located behind CityPlex Towers) and create a reimagined academic facility for the Biology and Chemistry Department. This will give students and faculty more space for research projects, lab work, and experiments. With environmental sustainability in mind, ORU could also incorporate new features such as a greenhouse, a pollinator garden, and indoor/outdoor classrooms.
