At the 2025 Entrepreneur's Cup, considered Oklahoma's premier collegiate business plan competition, ORU students brought home two first-place awards and one for second place. Freshman Daniel Kringel won the top prize-and \$21,000-in the High Growth Undergraduate division. In the Small Business division, an ORU team led by junior Timothy Blanco finished first and won \$12,000. Another ORU team led by Gabriela Blanco took second place, worth \$8,000. In the 90-second pitch competition, Gabriela also earned a \$1,000 prize. ORU was competing against more than 50 teams from across the state.
