


NEW LABS = NEW LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES

Students and faculty in the Computing and Mathematics Department had a lot to celebrate on November 8: the introduction of six new labs and a drone arena! These hi-tech facilities were made possible by a \$1.45 million grant from the A. R. and Marylouise Tandy Foundation. The six labs are Game Development, Nanotechnology Research, Artificial Intelligence, Plasma Physics Research, Edge Computing, and Network Administration. When it comes to career preparation, this department's graduates will be ahead of the curve, thanks to the instruction they receive from their dedicated professors and the access they now have to cutting-edge technology and learning experiences.

STATE CAPITOL EXPERIENCE

Twenty ORU students representing all classes and multiple majors took part in the November 13-17 Oklahoma Intercollegiate Legislature (O.I.L.). This mockgovernment competition is held every semester at the Capitol in Oklahoma City. It gives college students a chance to see how government works, and how to "write, debate, and pass legislation." Competing against students from 12 other schools, the ORU team won 1st place in Press (Communication senior Stephanie Conchas) and also won the Community Service competition. Other awards included 1st runnerup for Best Senate Delegate (Political Science senior Patrick Humphrey), 1st runner-up for Best House Delegation, 2nd runner-up for Best Freshman Senator (Business Administration junior Katrina Briggs), and honorable mention for Best Freshman House Representative (Political Science junior Isaiah Osei). ORU's Senate had five bills passed; three also passed in the House. ORU's House had four bills passed; one also passed in the Senate and was signed by the governor of O.I.L. Becky Mills serves as the faculty advisor of ORU's O.I.L. delegation.

LAUNCHING NEW BUSINESSES

The final round of the Stovall Center for Entrepreneurship's premier event, The Launch, was held on November 23. The competition began with more than 60 students who had a wide variety of ideas for new businesses. After the first round on October 26, six of the fourteen teams moved on to the finals. First prize of \$5,000 went to Daniel Kringel, a freshman Entrepreneurship major whose "He Has a Name" is "redefining event interaction and community engagement with its NFC (near field communication) iConnect Bracelet." The 2nd- and 3rd-place teams received \$3,000 and \$2,000, respectively. There is also a People's Choice award. Judges are drawn from the business community. The Launch is sponsored by Bob Goshen.
