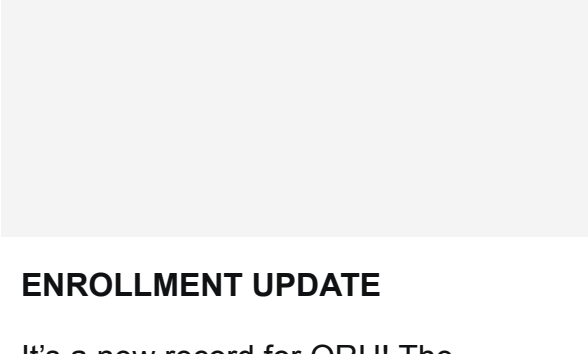


## PLAY BALL!

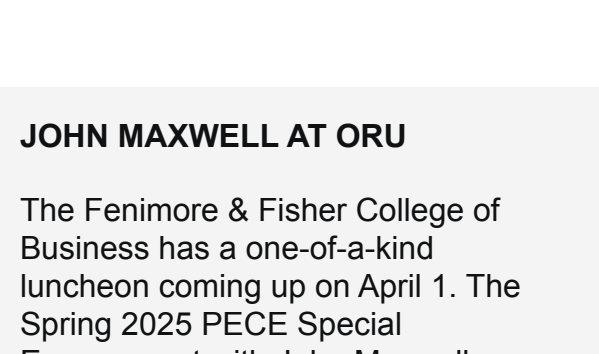
### COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

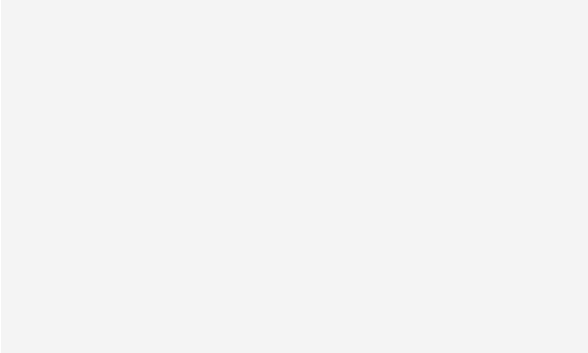

Every guest will receive a copy of John's most recent book, *High Road Leadership*. (PECE stands for Partners in Economics, Commerce, and Entrepreneurship.)

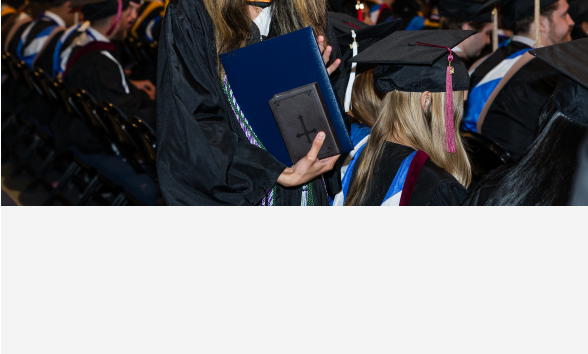

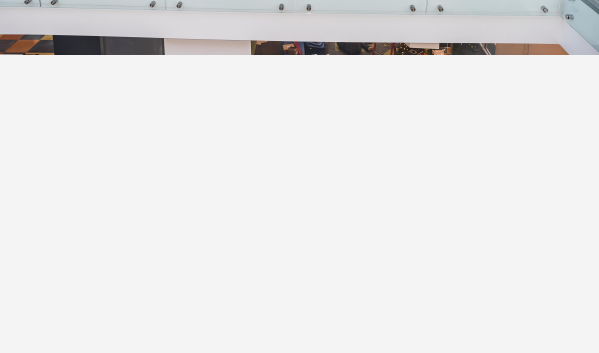

### WALL STREET JOURNAL SURVEY

There's still time for current students and those who graduated from ORU in the past five years to take part in a Wall Street Journal survey. It asks for the participants' opinions and views of the university where they received their degree. Topics asked about will concern ORU's undergraduate degree program. Survey results will form the core component of the Journal's new college rankings—to be published in September 2025—which can give prospective students helpful information as they are choosing a college. The survey takes about 10 minutes and will be available through May 2025. Last fall, ORU ranked 8th in the nation for Student Experience as a result of this survey.

### FOLMAR'S BIG WIN

Head Coach Ryan Folmar marked his 400th career win at ORU on February 14. It happened when the Golden Eagles won the second game of a doubleheader against Arkansas-Pine Bluff. He is the second ORU coach (after Larry Cochell, with 428 wins) to achieve this milestone. He became ORU's head coach in 2013.

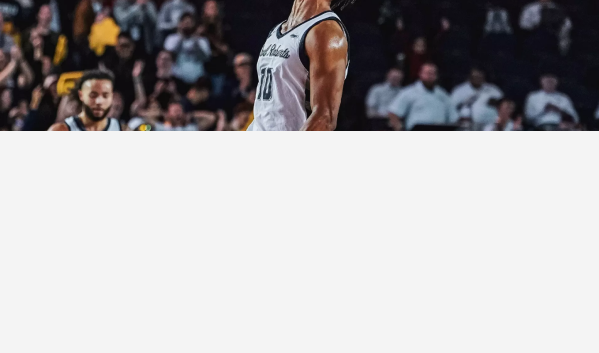


### BACK-TO-BACK

This year, the women's basketball team achieved back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time since 2010-11/2011-12. At the end of the regular season, their record stood at 22-7. They earned the #2 seed in the Summit League tournament and made it to the championship game, ultimately losing to South Dakota State. However, there's more! The team received a bid to the Women's Basketball Invitational Tournament (WBIT) and will take on Missouri State in a March 20 match-up.

### REACHING MILESTONES

In ORU's February 19 game against the Denver Pioneers, guard Issac McBride surpassed 2,000 points for his overall college basketball career. (He played one season at Vanderbilt before coming to ORU.) By season's end, he had moved into 10th place on ORU's most-points-scored list with a grand total of 1,966 points.

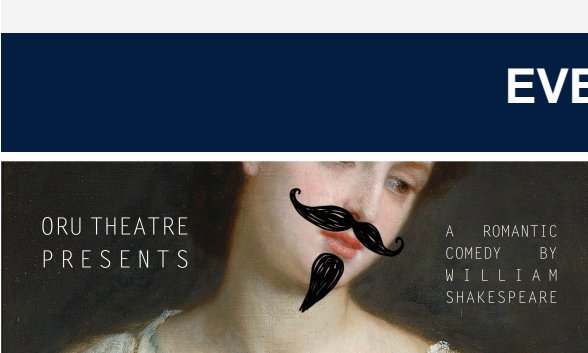

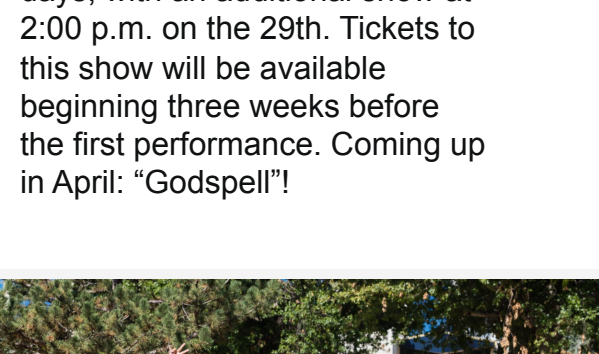


### BACK TO THE BARD

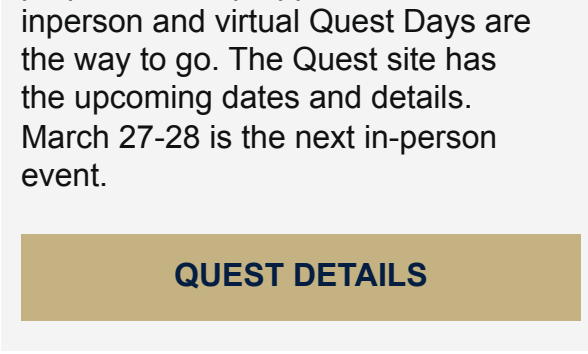

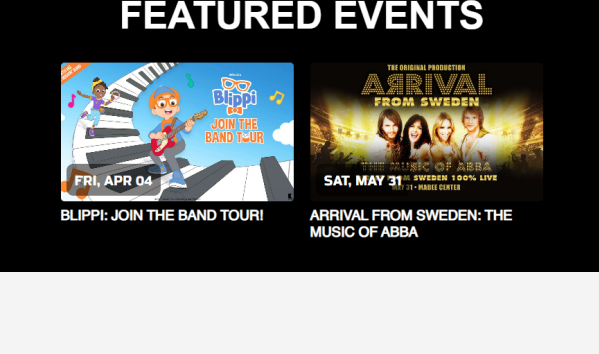
### MUSIC & DANCE AT THE MAC
