

HONORED

NATIONAL ATHLETE OF THE WEEK

Golden Eagle transfer Abraham **Chelangam** is really making his mark at ORU. At the Bob Timmons Rim Rock Cross Country Classic in Lawrence, Kansas, on August 31, he took first in the 6000m and set a new course record of 17:45 in the process. Then, on September 9, he was named National Athlete of the Week (NCAA Div. 1-Men) by the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association. Abraham is ORU's first cross country athlete to earn this honor during the cross country season.

ON THE PITCH & ON THE COURT

Fall sports are in full swing. On September 1, the **men's soccer** team defeated #24-ranked University of California-Santa Barbara by a score of 2-1. In a matter of hours, the Golden Eagles rose to the **#18** spot in the **Top Drawer Soccer College** Soccer National Rankings. They also reached a 2-2 tie in the September 10 Mayor's Cup match with the University of Tulsa; that meant ORU was able to keep the Cup for another year. The women's soccer team faced the University of Tulsa in a Mayor's **Cup** match on August 29. The end result was a tied score – 1-1 – and ORU retained possession of the Cup for the second year in a row. The **women's golf team** finished the September 9-10 Payne Stewart Memorial in a tie for second (out of 12 teams). The volleyball team has a new practice gym and locker room inside the Mabee Center-and a challenging schedule to go along with it.
