Name of Scholarship	Awarding Criteria
1. Donna & Robert L. Brorein Jr. Graduate Education Financial Assistance Fund	To provide financial assistance to international graduate education students
2. Drs. John and Radine Frisbie Scholarship	Awarded annually, and preferably to special education teacher candidates
3. Hannah-Joy T. Mankey Endowed Scholarship Fund	To provide financial support for students with demonstrated financial need (undergraduate and graduate) especially students majoring in TESL or minoring in missions
4. Hazel Tyson Ware Endowed Scholarship	<p>Awarded in order of preference:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Students pursuing a Bachelor of Science degree in education with emphasis in special education who have desire to work with hard of hearing and speech impaired students.</li> <li>2. Students pursuing a Bachelor of Science degree in education with a degree emphasis in special education</li> </ol>
5. International Student Education Scholarship Fund	To provide support to international students enrolled in College of Education.
6. John and Heidi Bersin Scholarship	Must meet one of the following criterion: female Bulgarian, International students, majoring in education, with a GPA of 3.0 or better
7. Josephine Richard Memorial Scholarship for Christian Education	To provide financial support to students majoring in Christian education with demonstrated financial need, having divorced biological parents or one or no surviving parent.
8. Mary Martha Black Scholarship	For freshman and sophomore students with declared Education majors with a GPA of at least 2.0. Money can be applied to tuition, room and board, textbooks, supplies or student school loans. Receipt of scholarship – total of 2 years

11. Ruth L. Lucardi Scholarship	For students in the College of Education
12. Temple Foundation Scholarship	Provides scholarship monies to undergraduate teacher candidates and first- and second-year teachers who want to work or currently work in Oklahoma schools. These Oklahoma schools should be under-performing schools or Title I with high-need students, however those working in private education may apply as well. Each scholarship recipient must be willing to work in this Oklahoma school for a minimum of three years after graduation. In addition, undergraduate teacher candidates must be willing to student teach in a high-need school before graduation.
