Cultural Boxes - Magic Key to Global Understanding "I hear and I forget. I see and I remember. I do and I understand," Confucius. This quote describes the impact of the Culture Box Program, started in 1992 at Tulsa's Eisenhower International School as a joint project with the Tulsa Global Alliance. Eisenhower is Oklahoma's only immersion school. At present, 43 cultures are represented by 49 boxes which are checked out by teachers, principals, scout troops, home schools, clubs, camps, etc., reaching 5,000 per year. Boxes contain artifacts, lessons, books, music, videos, clothes, foods, spices, maps, dolls, games, etc. Children test the recipes, read the books, smell the spices, hold the dolls, copy the art, etc. Grants have funded the project.
