Several calls have come into the office inquiring of the new design of dissertation prospectus. Information provided below should answer the questions:

#### DISSERTATION PREPARATION COURSES

Dissertation preparation has been expanded to include four short courses leading up to and including the writing of chapter one. Each course is .5 credit hours, and the total of 2.0 dissertation hours will be taken from the dissertation block so the total number of hours for the degree is unchanged. The courses are to be taken in order, but the timing is a matter of advisement and will vary with the individual degree plan. All courses are pass/fail and each course must be passed before continuing to the next.

## A new policy regarding plagiarism has been adopted and is included in the handbooks:

Cheating in any form, including plagiarism, is a serious academic offense and will not be tolerated. Consequences include a zero on the assignment and may include an F for the course, academic probation, suspension, or expulsion from the program. Plagiarism is defined in each course syllabus.

ORU and the College of Education has clarified the policy regarding Incomplete grades which reads as follows:

In accordance with the ORU and College of Education policy:

Incomplete "I" grades will be granted only to those candidates who have experienced a catastrophic event. The issuance of an "I" grade should be considered a very rare occurrence. Those candidates who have experienced a catastrophic event and require additional time to complete the course assignments must request an "I" prior to the final course post assignment, exam or capstone activity deadlines

The ORU library now has access to the full text catalog of ProQuest's dissertations and theses. As many of you know, in the past we had to make an appointment with library staff to search dissertation abstracts, and even then, few dissertations were available. Now you can download PDFs of complete dissertations.

Not only is it important to check dissertations to be sure that your study has not already been done, but dissertations themselves can be excellent resources, especially the reference section of recent dissertations.

Go to <a href="http://www.oru.edu/library/">http://www.oru.edu/library/</a> (at some point you will need to log in using your Novell log in and password). On this page, right under the tabbed items is a small heading: <a href="Resources">Resources</a> Under Resources is a link to <a href="Database List">Database List</a>. At this list you will see Database by Title. Scroll down to the [D] section and you will find Dissertations & Theses: Full Text. Just below that are Dissertations specific to ORU. Enter the database and carry out a standard search

If you are a doctoral student having trouble accessing the library while waiting to register for dissertation hours, contact the Eagle Card Center at 918-495-7256 and ask about the Associates Alumni Card.
