English Language Teaching in the Global Classroom (Education and English)

Target audience

Those who desire to teach English as a Second Language internationally or those who desire to teach English at the Middle school level here in the states.

Summary of topic coverage or curriculum

This program is a combination of English Language Learning (ELL) courses, English courses, reading courses, and pedagogy courses

Job opportunities

The English and education departments consistently receive inquires for teachers who are willing to go to international countries to teach English. We currently have several English and ELL graduates who are teaching in international countries. We believe this degree will better equip individuals with strong writing, reading, and ELL teaching strategies. Additionally, we believe international students would come to ORU seeking such a degree to teach English in their native countries. Persons with this degree would be in high demand. There are literally thousands of positions currently available for TESOL teachers. According to many job placement websites, there are currently over 20,000 job opportunities for teaching English abroad.

Global implications (how the 7 global lens questions apply)

This degree certainly prepares students to live and work in a global marketplace. Internships could be completed internationally. Because all of the courses are currently offered, they are aligned with the university outcomes. While there are no current partnerships, they could be developed with other higher education institutions who could supervise student teaching internships. Additionally, partnerships could be developed with international P-12 schools for internship placement purposes. Courses could eventually be developed as online courses. I think it is important to have assignments in courses to be inclusive of cultures represented in the courses.
