
Dr. Ma has accepted an invitation from Hindawi Publishing Corporation to join the Editorial Board of the International Journal of Vehicular Technology.

The Behavioral Sciences Department has been actively recruiting and interviewing junior Social Work majors for the Child Welfare Professional Enhancement Program (CWPEP). The Oklahoma Department of Human Services has interviewed our candidates and we are pleased to announce the addition of five students to the program this year for a total of seven students on contract. These students receive a \$7,128 annual stipend for both the junior and senior years, as well as the commitment to full-time employment with Oklahoma DHS in the Child Welfare area upon graduation. The Social Work department also benefits from additional dollars provided by the grant to attend continuing education conferences. Shay White is a senior Social Work major who was accepted into the CWPEP program last year. She is currently completing her Senior Practicum with the DHS office in

downtown Tulsa. Her unit is involved in permanency planning. This office works with children in the system by helping reunify families or finding permanent and loving homes for those whose parental rights have been terminated.
