- One reference from school counselor, teacher or principal.
- ACT, PSAT or SAT scores.
- TOEFL or English Language equivalent score.
- Copy of passport, F1 visa and I-20. This is for students going to 10th, 11th and 12th\*\* grade.
- Medical information may be required.

- B2 visa holders may also apply.\*\*
