

Dr. Charles Snow

Ministry

Upon joining the ORU faculty in 1983, Dr. Charles Snow served as undergraduate Church Ministries Degrees Coordinator, an assistant professor in the theology department, and founding director of the Institute of Charismatic Studies. In 1984 he became director of the Division of Special Instructional Programs. In 1985 he moved to the Graduate School of Theology and Ministry where he was associate dean of doctoral studies and a professor of practical theology. While in those positions he directed the Doctor of Ministry program and taught in the practices of ministry area of the curriculum.

January 1, 1995, Snow became lead pastor of the Bethel Temple in Fort Worth, TX where he served for six and one-half years. While there he led the church staff, the church, a child development center, and a K4 thru 8 elementary school. The church dedicated a new family life center with a full-size gymnasium, youth game rooms, and a commercial kitchen and celebrated the church's sixtieth anniversary, May, 2001.

In August of 2001 Snow rejoined the faculty of the ORU Graduate School of Theology and Ministry as Professor of Preaching and Leadership. During the 2002-03 academic year, Dr. Snow was voted outstanding faculty member in the Graduate School of Theology and Ministry and also received the Eugene Swearingen Award as the university's outstanding faculty member. During 2003-04 Snow was acting director of the ORU School of Healing and received the GSTM Faculty Service Award. He taught at Livets Ord University in Uppsala, Sweden in the fall of 2004 and has been involved in various continuing education programs through GSTM. He was a contributor to the Spirit-filled Life Study Bible, providing study notes for the book of Jonah. In 2008 he again was voted outstanding faculty member in the Graduate School of Theology and Ministry and also received the Harold and Edna Paul Award as the ORU outstanding faculty member.

Before joining the faculty of the University, Dr. Snow served seven years as training coordinator for David Wilkerson Crusades/World Challenge, Inc. There he was director of the Twin Oaks Leadership Academy for three years and the Institute of Christian Training for four years. Prior to his work with the

Wilkerson organization, he served churches in Missouri, Arkansas, and Texas with appointments as minister of Christian education, minister of youth, associate pastor, church planter, and senior pastor. Speaking from a background of 50 years in ministry, he shares insights gained through church, evangelism, campus, education, and training responsibilities. The above ministry opportunities have taken him to most areas of the United States and to several foreign countries.
