Master of Divinity degree in Theology from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary with 16 semester hours in psychology-related courses. Those courses were Pastoral

Care (4 hours, which required an 8-hour practicum weekly), Psychology of Religion (3 hours), Religious Factors in Personality Development (3 hours), and a 400-hour supervised practicum in Clinical Pastoral Education at the River Region Hospital, which included both individual and group counseling (6 hours).

Further study at Spalding University. Earned 9 graduate credits in psychology and special education. Those courses were Introduction to Counseling (involving some in-class as well as out-of-class counseling experiences, 3 hours), History of Psychology (3 hours), Assessment of Special Needs Students (involved a project dealing with the special needs of a student, 3 hours).

Master of Arts degree in Clinical Psychology from Fisk University, which was a cooperative program with Meharry Medical College. Completed 45 hours of graduate credits in psychology, which included Assessment I and II and 480 hours of supervised practica experiences. Those practica experiences, which spanned three semesters, included actual experiences in psychological assessment, and individual and group counseling at the Meharry Community Mental Health Center.

Completed an Ed.D. degree in Human Development Counseling at Peabody College of Vanderbilt University. Completed 45 additional graduate credits in courses such as Career Development, which included several projects, testing, scoring, and interpretation of tests, including assessment of a prison population; Community Counseling, which included a major project that was community oriented; Counseling Diverse Populations, which included a unit and a major project on Cross-Culture Counseling; and Advanced Practicum, which required 210 hours of supervised-practicum experiences at the Father Ryan High School. That practicum included work in individual and group counseling (group counseling was with a group of students who had family members who had an alcohol problem and another group of students who had adaptation problems), consultation, and completing students' class schedules. It also included a 2-hour weekly seminar of on-campus and individual supervision by a Human Development Counseling faculty member; an Internship in Counseling, which required 300 hours at an on-site placement, an hour of weekly on-site supervision, scheduled on-campus supervision, and seminar sessions. For this internship, worked at the Dede Wallace Drug and Alcohol Center, doing such things as individual and group counseling with drug and alcohol clients, staffings, staff meetings, intake interviews, and record-keeping; and counseling supervision, which entailed supervision of a student who was doing a practicum in a high school setting. Was supervised weekly by a Human Development Counseling faculty member.

Completed all requirements except internship for certification in school psychology for the state of Kentucky at Eastern Kentucky University. Those courses included Secondary Curriculum (3 hours), Educational Administration (3 hours), Introduction to School Psychology (3 hours), Advanced Assessment of Children (3 hours), and Practicum in School Psychology (4 hours).

Have worked as a Psychiatric Chaplain in a large state penitentiary for a year-and-a-half, which involved among other things some individual and group counseling. Was
