3. **TOPIC:** Update on ALEKS-PPL (math placement) – Dr. JayneAnn Harder

DISCUSSION: Dr. JayneAnn Harder gave an update on why ALEKS-PPL (Assessment and Learning and Knowledge Spaces) should be adopted. She shared that a failure to pass the general education mathematics courses is a leading cause of college student dropouts and gave additional insight into how ALEKS-PPL can help improve pass rates for these courses. She shared that students who have taken the assessment improved their grades. Information on the assessment can be found at: www.oru.edu/academics/cose/computing-and-mathematics/aleks.php. If students have not taken a math test before at ORU, they must take the ALEKS-PPL placement test on October 6 at 10:30 a.m. in Zoppelt. The untimed exam usually takes approximately 1 ½ hours.

All incoming freshmen will receive an email on the ALEKS-PPL process before they attend ORU and are encouraged, but are not required, to complete the exam over the summer. Students will access the following website to take the placement exam: www.aleksppl.oru.edu. All ORU department chairs have information related to the ALEKS-PPL which includes information for advising purposes. Dr. Lang reports that current Calculus students who have gone through the ALEKS-PPL process are more prepared. ALEKS-PPL will be a part of the required course materials so no additional fees will be required at the time of application. The Academic Council encouraged Dr. Harder and other team members to continue taking steps toward making ALEKS-PPL accessible to students who do not have computers and to our virtual students.
