Door Prizes	Mrs. Lisa Wilson coordinated a give-away of the flowers on each table.
Devotional	Dr. Larry Hart gave a devotional from Luke 19, Zacchaeus, noting the emphasis throughout Luke on <i>today</i> . Jesus was seeking him, and declared salvation had come to his house <i>today</i> , as Zacchaeus evidenced all four attributes of repentance. We cannot change the past or know the future; we can acknowledge and allow God to work in our lives today.
President's Report	Dr. Wilson's report included updates on the University and upcoming events:
	Recognition ORU was noted as a College of Distinction, both among colleges in Oklahoma and among Christian Colleges by <i>Colleges of Distinction</i> , a national reviewing and reporting organization. Globalization: China In the midst of political and economic changes in China, ORU continues to make connections with Chinese schools and students. Dr. Reid-Martinez just returned from China, and Jenny Fang, coordinator of Asian initiatives, is there now. We now have nine MOUs with Chinese institutions and are active on social media, with up to 10,000 engagements on WeChat. We are hosting a visiting scholar and a number of Chinese students. Fall 2018 we may have 30+ Chinese students, the largest group from any single nation.
	Globalization: Study Abroad Report from Dr. Kevin Schneider: There were 7 students in the Paris program for Fall 2017. There is room for 12, with 7 currently committed for Fall 2018. The program includes cultural immersion, language immersion, and an ION Virtual Reality internship. The Bulgaria/ Greece program will study the convergence of governmental and economic systems, with 6 committed for Fall 2018 of a maximum of 15. Australia is currently in development, as is Israel, with 5 having expressed interest in Israel for Spring 2019. New Dormitory Plans are being made to break ground next month on the first new dorm at ORU since 1976. It should be finished for Fall 2019. There will be men's and women's towers connected by a common area. The lower floors are apartment style with two bedrooms; upper floors are dorm-style. Student focus groups are informing final decisions about floor plans. Please pray. We are committed to building debt-free and \$3 to \$4 million is still needed to include all the features we want to. (Presentation included architect's renderings.)
	New Intramural Fields University property on the SE corner of 81 st and Lewis will be the new home of intramural fields for softball, football/lacrosse, and soccer. There will be lights, restrooms, and storage. Tax regulations require ORU to demonstrate use of the property. The project is

paid for and is in the works. (Presentation included diagram of the layout of the property/fields.)

Citiplex Parking Garage

A parking garage connecting to the Citiplex west tower (orthopedic surgical hospital and rehab) is moving forward. Three levels will all connect to the hospital to provide access to current and incoming tenants.

Legislation Affecting Student Financing

Please pray for the legislation currently under consideration that affects student financing, the PROSPER Act a re-authorization of the HEA. Sen. Alexander's goal is to see fewer options provided for students—one loan, grant, and work. Perkins loans, which have been available for high risk students and often fill the gap when other sources have been depleted, have been discontinued for this fall. This disproportionately affects 1st generation and minority students. ORU has several hundred who will be affected. This is a particular challenge for sophomores and upper classmen who have received the loan in the past. The ORU administration has been working on other provisions, but there are no good options yet. If HEA is passed, it may raise limits on other resources and relieve some pressure, but it is unlikely to go through by fall. This represents a significant decrease in the federal government's investment in higher education. Serious intercession is needed for Congress, the Senate, and our students.

University Planning Council

The UPC will meet this Thursday and evaluate progress with existing KPIs (80-90% met) and consider new ones. Impact 2030, an initiative to envision the future of ORU will be a major topic. More about Impact 2030 will be forthcoming, and faculty may be called upon to participate by contributing research and writing.

Provost's Report: Dr. Reid-Martinez (Provost)

Dr. Reid-Martinez read the summary report of the ORU Academic Council meeting held on March 12, 2018.

- -The Council approved the addition of the Student Learning Committee to the Handbook and requested a clarification in the rotation schedule and the status of a member of the SLC as a member of the IIUC.
- -Exceptions to the GO-course requirement will be made for transfer students graduating in Spring 2019.
- -The Council unanimously approved the recommendations for Faculty Emeritus status to the President and Board of Trustees for final approval. The College Deans and Dr. Reid-Martinez will continue to gather information about Faculty Emeriti recommendations and resources among other universities.

The report was accepted unanimously following a motion by Dr. Dyson and seconded by Dr. Synan.
