Door Prizes Mrs. Lisa Wilson coordinated a give-away of prizes in addition to University calendars given to all.

Devotional Dr. William Lyons gave a devotional from Acts 3:1-9. Peter and John encountered a lame man at the temple, extended a right hand—symbolizing greeting, acknowledgement, and respect—and brought healing. This was the aftermath to and outworking of Pentecost. The power was manifest in the daily work of ministry. In the early chapters of Acts societal barriers were breached, social conventions upended, and a new covenant community was formed. Just as Jesus crossed barriers, we must as well.

President's Report

Dr. Wilson's report included updates on the University and upcoming events:

New Faculty
The new faculty stood to introduce themselves with name, department, and a little known fact about themselves.

Faculty Life Committee
Members of the Faculty Life Committee were acknowledged. Faculty are encouraged to convey thoughts, questions, or concerns to the FLC.

Enrollment Update
Initial enrollment reports look positive; the census day is September 10. The loss of the Perkins Loan has slowed the process, but has not had an adverse effect, as was the concern. The incoming freshman class represents 44 US states and 53 countries. The top states (in order) are Oklahoma, Texas, Missouri, California, and Florida. The top countries are Nigeria, China, Kenya, Mexico, and Ghana.

Partnership with Church of the King
ORU is partnering with Church of the King in a pilot program with the leadership development program of a local church. The outcomes look promising, with the church community being served and students enrolling at ORU: First-time, full-time 1st year students-23, 2nd year new students-5, returning 2nd year students-16, non-degree students-11, Fall 2017 student count-15, and Spring 2018 student count-16.

Cityplex
Progress is being made with plans and permits for a parking garage on the west side of Citiplex. This has enabled a 10-year contract with Oklahoma Surgical Hospital and Advanced Orthopedics. In many ways, the original intent of the building as a place of service and healing is taking place. These contracts, along with the US Army Corps of Engineers' occupancy, are expected to bring in \$58 million over the next 10 years. This is a wonderful provision for the University.

	<p>Victory Building Looking toward future growth, ORU has signed a letter of intent to buy the Victory building across 81st street. The deans have toured the building and will be putting forth their ideas as to how their college could use the space in the future. Major points included:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The Council recognized that a broad curriculum map of both curricular and co-curricular leadership competencies at ORU should be developed to assure the appropriate leadership growth in ORU students. - In discussing how being truly Holy-Spirit empowered can transform teaching, the Council requested that resources be dedicated to this aspect of excellence in teaching, as well as the art of pedagogy that could assist teachers in both the content and delivery of their programs. - The Council voted to create a digital space where faculty can share their good practices related to the integration of Spirit-empowered faith in their experiential engagement of students and cognitive learning from the classroom context. -The Academic Council will present a letter to the President and the Board of Trustees in support of the Impact 2030 vision presented by President Wilson earlier this month. <p>The report was accepted unanimously following a motion by Dr. Culp and seconded by Dr. Ellis.</p>
