President’s Report

Dr. Wilson’s report included updates on the University and upcoming events:

Empower 21 Kickoff in Brazil
Dr. Wilson returned this morning from the Empower 21 Kickoff in Brazil. There were excellent meetings and much interest in ORU. Pray for Brazil and the upcoming election.

Enrollment Update—Final Census for Fall
We are celebrating 10 years of continual growth in enrollment—only three colleges in OK to experience growth this year. We have students from all 50 states and 106 nations. The top states are Oklahoma, Texas, California, Florida, and Colorado. The top nations (outside US) are Nigeria, India, South Korea, China, and Brazil. The top declared majors are ministry & leadership, nursing, engineering, and a tie between psychology and biology. First year student retention is 84.2%. Second year student retention is 85.2%, a new record. Enrollment at census 2018, compared to 2017:

<p>Provost's Report: Dr. Reid-Martinez (Provost)</p>	<p>Dr. Reid-Martinez read the summary report of the ORU Academic Council meeting held on September 17, 2018. Major points included:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Four new General Education courses were approved unanimously: GEN 307 Women's History: A Journey to Empowerment; GEN 343 Middle East Today; GEN 377 Christian Worldview, Culture, and Apologetics. -Two new science electives were approved: CSC 111 Introduction to Computing; CSC 201 Introduction to Data Science -Earlier in the year, a new General Education Scaffolded Interdisciplinary course was approved by electronic vote: GEN355/CHRM 355 Monotheistic Religion Conflict and Convergence. - Approval of a policy on general education SIC courses for undergrad pro-professional programs without professional undergraduate accrediting bodies. -Discussion continued on how to best create a virtual space for faculty to share good practices in teaching. <p>In response to questions from the floor, it was clarified that science courses are 3.0 hours each and that one of the new courses will begin this spring and the others Fall 2019.</p> <p>The report was accepted unanimously following a motion by Dr. Ellis and seconded by Dr. Farmer.</p>
