Door Prizes	Mrs. Lisa Wilson coordinated the door prizes—gift cards.	
Devotional	Dr. Larry Hart gave a devotional from Acts 1:1-11, focusing on "This same Jesus". The work of the apostles, the ministry of Oral Roberts, the church, and the ministry of Dr. Wilson and the ORU faculty are a continuation of work of Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit. In closing, Dr. Hart led the faculty in singing <i>He Keeps Me Singing</i> and <i>Jesus is Coming Soon</i> .	
President's report	Dr. Wilson's report included updates on the recent meeting of the Board of Trustees, the University and upcoming events: The November meeting of the ORU Board of Trustees was held in Washington, DC and included a meeting at and private tour of the Museum of the Bible. The museum is a must-see tribute to the power of God's word throughout history. Dr. Wilson met with OK Sen. James Lankford and OK Sen. James Inhofe. Sen. Inhofe led a Board devotional. Dr. Wilson also met with Sen. Lamar Alexander, chairman of the Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions committee, and with Rep. Diane Black, Chair of the House Budget Committee regarding legislation and regulations that affect university students. The discontinuation of the Perkins Loans affects 700-800 ORU students—24% of ORU students are 1st generation college attendees. Dr. Wilson urged prayer for our government. Dr. Wilson's report to the Board included statistics on enrollment—3917 students on census day and a final total of 4037 at this point in the semester. The dramatic increase in dorm residency and projected growth indicates a need for additional campus housing. The ORU Freshman Fall-to-Fall Retention 2010-2017 report shows a steady increase in the retention rate. With a retention rate of 84%, ORU is listed by USN&WR in the Top 10 best retention schools among Evangelical affiliated universities. This despite a higher acceptance rate than other the universities in the Top 10. The WSJ/Times Higher Education College Rankings 2018 ranked ORU 8th in the nation among all universities in Student Engagement. In light of the marketplace, needs, and ORU's mission, increased offerings in the health sciences are being explored, including the feasibility of re-opening a medical school. The Board approved the 120 credit hour degree minimum.	

faculty scholarship: "Additional discussion and recommendation from the Executive Session of the Committee included that the Academic Affairs committee clarified expectations on faculty promotions, which included that the academic community continue to increase expectations on faculty each year to improve in the areas of research and scholarship. Recognizing that raising faculty scholarship was a multi-year process, they recommended that over the next three years the scholarship would increase each year so that by the end of this time-frame all faculty coming forward for promotion or tenure would clearly demonstrate a high level of scholarship appropriate for the proposed rank".

In future, the Academic Affairs committee will be examining applications for promotion and tenure closely, especially regarding research and scholarship. In coming days, the Provost's office will be "unpacking" this statement.

Provost's Report: Dr. Reid-Martinez (Provost)

Dr. Reid-Martinez read the summary report of the ORU Academic Council meeting held on November 20, 2017. The primary business related to the General Education Curriculum Committee report and courses presented for approval. University Learning Outcomes and Proficiencies and their assessment were discussed, as were the definitions and rubrics related to GO courses and intercultural experiences. A handout was provided. Report accepted by unanimous vote.

Questions Dr. Wilson and Dr. Reid-Martinez accepted questions from the floor: A correction to the online app was noted. Do the statistics on student retention include the Bridge students? Dr. Wilson—yes, they do. The retention rate would have been higher if this group had been omitted. Given the exploration of the idea of re-opening the medical school, what about the City of Faith Hospital? Dr. Wilson—there are no plans to open a hospital. Citiplex currently has a hospital. Partnerships may be explored. Regarding student engagement—faculty comment that ORU students are engaged in so many things that at times, they could be encouraged to be more "engaged" in their academic pursuits. Regarding the Board Academic Affairs committee statement on research and scholarship—what does "academic community" mean regarding standards in advancement in rank? Dr. Wilson and Dr. Reid-Martinez—this will be a matter of ongoing discussion. However, this involves every level, from the faculty up. Before applications reach the university administration and Board, faculty and the college has recommended them.

Dr. Jonathan Wiley led the closing prayer.
