President's Report	Dr. Wilson's report included updates on the University and upcoming events: Enrollment ORU has had 11 years consecutive years of enrollment growth, with a total FTE of 3495, and is one of only three private universities in OK with an increase in enrollment this year. The number of full-time undergraduates was down slightly, due in part to a mid-course correction raising the discount rate. This allowed us to stay within budget for scholarships and is healthy for academic programs. The loss of the Perkins loan affected retention. Growth in the graduate and online programs account for the growth overall. An increase of the number of students in residence halls confirms the viability of high quality housing offerings, with a total of 2082, 83% of students living on campus. The top five majors, in order are: Ministry & Leadership, Nursing, Psychology, Business Administration, and Engineering. The student body is 59.2% female, 40.8% male. Diversity continues to increase, with 43.8% Caucasian students. International students comprise 18.9%—close to the 20% target. The top five nations are, in order: Nigeria, China, Brazil, India, and Singapore. The New Faculty Dinner with the Wilsons will be held October 9th.

The Faculty Christmas Reception will be held December 9th.

Administrative Changes

A number of administrative changes have been made in light of the Impact 2030 initiatives and the need to assist the Provost in these implementations:

Dr. Kim Boyd will serve as Assistant to the Provost to establish the Academy for Exceptional and Effective Teaching while continuing as Dean of the College of Education. Dr. Ken Weed will serve as Assistant to the Provost for Academic Excellence while continuing to serve as Dean of the College of Science and Engineering. Dr. Connie Sjorberg will become the Chief Academic Registrar and continue to teach in Behavioral Sciences. Dr. Mark Hall, Dean of the College of Arts and Cultural Studies, who has made significant contributions to academic programs, has been granted a one-year sabbatical beginning Fall 2020, after which he will return to the Department of English and Modern Languages as a member of the faculty. The College of Arts and Cultural Studies is beginning the search for a new dean to start Summer 2010.

Provost's Report: Dr. Reid-Martinez

Dr. Reid-Martinez continued with details of the administrative changes. She expressed her thanks to Dr. Hall and to Dr. Boyd, Dr. Weed, and Dr. Sjorberg for their willingness to take on these new responsibilities. Additionally:

Dr. Hallett Hullinger will serve as Associate Dean of the College of Education.

Dr. William Ranahan is now serving as the Chair of the Department of Biology and Chemistry.

Professor Bill Crawford will serve as the Chair of Graduate Programs in Business. Scott Williams of Athletics will serve as the Chair of Health, Leisure, and Sports Sciences.

Dr. James Barber will serve as the Chair of the Doctorate of Ministry.

Dr. Reid-Martinez presented a summary report on the September 23 meeting of the Academic Council:

The Gen Ed Committee announced that all students currently under the 2019-2020 catalogue must complete a GO course for graduation. GO course proposals for next year's catalog must meet the November deadline. The Council approved the Gen Ed Scaffolded Interdisciplinary course GEN 322: Leading Through Disaster.

	The University Administration is announcing the following policy and procedure regarding posthumous degrees and degrees "in Memoriam": "Upon the death of a current or former student of ORU who has not graduated, the university may award a posthumous degree or degree "In Memoriam" at the discretion of the President and Board of Trustees." The report was accepted by a unanimous voice vote following a motion by Dr. Agena Farmer, seconded by Dr. Sherri Tapp.
