Door Prizes Mrs. Lisa Wilson welcomed faculty and coordinated a give-away.

Devotional Dr. Chance Bosch, College of Education, spoke on How is God Leading You? An important aspect of developing leadership in others is being aware of how God is leading us. Elijah had seen God speak in a dramatic way and had expected to encounter Him in the earthquake, wind, or fire. Yet God spoke in a gentle whisper. Dr. Bosch had experienced a miraculous recovery from heart stoppage that changed his life direction. He encouraged the faculty to be open to being led in new, even unfamiliar ways.

President's Report

Dr. Wilson's report included updates on the University and upcoming events:

Fall Break Travel
Dr. Wilson hosted a President's Circle meeting in Asheville, NC, kicking off a new capital campaign. Commitments have been made for nearly \$50 million of the \$75 million needed for the building projects. In Israel, he was able to work on the Summer 2020 E21 conference and record four TV shows. En route to South Korea, Dr. Wilson stopped in Hong Kong to meet with Board member Dr. Hugo Chan. He met Drs. Wonsuk and Julie Ma in Seoul, where he preached in Yoido Full Gospel Church and met with alumni.

VR Conference in China
At the invitation and expense of the Chinese government, Mike Matthews presented for the 2nd time at a national conference on Virtual Reality in Nanchang. In China, ORU is recognized as a leader in the use of VR in education.

Blockchain Applications in Oklahoma and Washington, DC
Mike Matthews and Dr. Reid-Martinez spoke on blockchain use in education in the Oklahoma State Senate and later at the Department of Education in Washington, DC. ORU has become the undisputed thought leader in the OK Senate and the US Department of Education on blockchain.
