President's Report	Enrollment Update President Wilson reported on enrollment after the Spring 2022 census date. Overall enrollment is up 11% from last year, with an FTE increase of over 200. There was growth in every area, including full-time undergraduate, full-time graduate, dual/concurrent, and online enrollments. These numbers are remarkable in light of overall trends in Christian higher education.  The percentage of male students is up at 41.4%, along with African Americans at 17.5%, Asian Americans at 3.8%, and internationals at 18%. There is a slight decrease in the percentage of Native Americans at 2.9%, White at 40%, and two or more ethnicities at			
	Church backgrounds include nondenominational at 42.7%, Pentecostal 11.6%, Assemblies of God 9.46%, Baptist 6.78%, and Charismatic 5.98%.  The top states in residential programs in 2021-2022 are Oklahoma, Texas, Florida, Alabama, California, Missouri, and Illinois. Provost's Report: Dr. **Academic Council** Reid-Martinez At the February 21, 2022 meeting of the Academic Council, faculty reviewed ORU's use of digital diplomas and received updates from the Office of the Registrar. The Council voted on faculty emeriti, a general education course, and considered the 2023-2024 academic calendar. Graduating students will receive digital and physica diplomas. Alumni can request digital diplomas from the Registrar. Names of faculty recommended by vote to receive emeritus status will be forwarded to President and Board of Trustees for review and final vote at the Spring Board of Trustees meeting. The Academic Council voted to approve a proposal by the General Education Committee for team teaching GEN 402 Crafting Solutions to Global Health Issues. The Academic Council began consideration of the 2023-2024 Academic Calendar. Discussion points included students having the time to complete academic requirements along with their other commitments, the financial impact of a longer semester, and being aware of the extra time needed for move-in prior to classes beginning. A student poll was suggested. The Council referred the Academic Calendar discussion to the respective departments and college. The topic will be revisited at the March 2022 Academic

After a motion by Dr. E. Culp and a second by Dr. C. Ellis, the report was accepted unanimously.
