Welcome	Mrs. Lisa Wilson welcomed faculty and coordinated a give-away.					
Devotional	Dr. Kim Boyd, Dean of the College of Education, Assistant to the Provost for Exceptional Teaching & Innovation spoke on: 1) the responsibility of faculty to model the university outcome Spiritual Integrity; 2) the "fundamental task of the Christian educator is to incarnate an authentically Christian way of life"; and 3) realizing our goal is "that a generation to come may praise the Lord"—Ps. 102:18. Dr. Boyd concluded with a personal statement and plea that African-American students—and all students—find ORU a place of safety and acceptance.					
President's Report	Opening Celebrations -The grand opening of the ORU Campus Welcome Center was held September 14, 2022On September 23, 2022, ORU held a ribbon-cutting ceremony for the newly named and renovated Fenimore & Fisher College of Business. Fall 2022 Census Report: -ORU has experienced 14 consecutive years of enrollment growth. For the time, ORU is serving over 5000 students at the census date. -Overall enrollment was boosted by enrollment in the graduate and online programs. There was a slight (1%) decrease in full-time residential students. -Of full-time enrollments, 2414 are residential, 341 online. Of the residential students, 2067 are domestic and 347 international. We are serving the largest number of international students ever. -Of part-time residential students, over 30% are internationals, many of whom faced visa problems and will become full-time students. -All 50 states are represented, as well as 124 nations. -There was growth in the representation of several ethnicities. ORU student self-reports total: 14.9% African American, 4.7% Asian, 14.0% Hispanic, 3.1% Native American, 0.4% Hawai'ian/Pacific Is, 39.2% White, 4.2% 2 or more ethnicities, and 19.6% International. -Top majors include Ministry & Leadership, Nursing, Psychology, and Business Administration. -Fall to Spring campus-wide retention as 89%. However, the first-time, full-time Fall to Fall was retention was 81%. Department Reorganizations: Enrollment Management: Alison Vujnovic is the VP of Enrollment Management, which will include: Residential Recruiting, Admissions, Financial Aid, Student Success, Veterans Experience, the International Center, and Career Services.					

Global Learning & Innovation: Mike Matthews is the VP of Global Learning & Innovation, along with Associate VP Vinay Manda and Associate VP Nathan Carson. This department will include: IT, Innovation & Technology, Online Enrollment, Online Retention, Exploration of New Delivery systems including virtual, metaverse, etc.

Task Force

A new Task Force has been created on ORU's Student Readiness, Retention, and Graduation Rate, including representation from Enrollment, Student Success, Student Life, Academics, Financial Aid, Registrar, and Athletics. Dr. Reid-Martinez will chair. The purpose of the task force is to consider university-wide strategies to get an incoming student population often ill-prepared for college ready for life and work upon graduation.

Provost's Report: Dr. Reid-Martinez

The Academic Council met on September 19, 2022.

The Office of the Registrar noted three additional dates for awarding degrees have been approved to benefit online students. These are mid-March, early-July, and mid-October. There is still a single Commencement at the end of each spring semester.

The College of Science and Engineering proposed that spring and fall enrollment times be moved from midnight to another time to be selected. They also expressed concern for faculty notification in the student withdrawal process. The Registrar will review current policies and processes, and confer with the deans for further action.

The following were proposed by the General Education Committee and approved:

- -New course GEN 390 Integration of Psychology and Theology
- -New course GEN 350 The Bible and Bob Dylan
- -American Sign Language (ASL) can be used to fulfill the foreign language requirement.

New General Education Learning Outcomes were proposed to the Council. Council representatives will bring the outcomes to their colleges for review and provide feedback to the General Education Committee before this comes back to the Academic Council.

President Wilson asked for a vote to accept the report and the proposals approved by the Academic Council. Motion by Prof. Britany Gomez, second by Dr. Paul Vickery. Approved unanimously by voice vote. None opposed or abstaining.
