Welcome	Mrs. Lisa Wilson welcomed faculty and coordinated a give-away.				
Devotional	Jessica Tenorio, Director of International Student Relations, expressed gratitude for the impact that faculty has had on her own life as an international student and encouraged the faculty to be supportive of international students in their financial, emotional, and academic challenges, based on Matthew 25: 31-40.				
President's Report	New facultyPresident and Mrs. Wilson hosted a dinner for new faculty at their home. Homecoming—Was well attended, with events seeming more back to normal. Board of Trustees Meeting -The fall meeting included a dinner with international students. International students on average have less discount than domestic students, have a higher GPA, and higher retentional rate. -New trustees include: Cassie Byram, Reggie Dabbs, Gordon Helm, Faith Emmanuel Benson Idadhosa II, Daniela Freidzon McCabe, and Gary Nelson. -The Board is currently searching for new members with an academic background. Faculty are encouraged to make recommendations. -The Board approved promotions for: Dr. William Ranahan, Professor Dr. Carolyn Stubbs, Associate Professor Dr. Daniel Isgrigg, Associate Professor Prof. Daniel Eller, Assistant Professor -The Board approved sabbaticals for: Dr. Enrique Valderrama Dr. John Thompson Prof. Rafael Barreiro -The Board affirmed the launch of Phase II of the Whole Leaders for the Whole World campaign, which includes a new dining hall (\$25 million), two new residence halls (\$15 million), renovations to EMR and the Claudius residence halls (\$5 million). Faculty were encouraged to participate and provided with access to a salary reduction donation form. HLC—Site visit is February 26-28. Dr. Kenneth Weed was thanked for his work and leadership in preparing for the accreditation visit. Questions—President Wilson entertained questions from the faculty on a variety of topics, including:				

-Banquet area for the new dining hall, or continue to use GLC? If we keep the exisiting dining hall, there will be space for events. Current thinking is leaning toward building a combined residence and dining hall.

-Book recommendations? President Wilson is currently reading The 6 Types of Working Genius (Lecioni), Leadership Not by the Book (Green), Five Voices (Kubicek & Cockram), and Anderson Cooper on Vanderbilt family history.

-Importance of understanding personalities in leadership? (In response to Working Genius book). Helpful for self-understanding, but important not to pigeon-hole or limit people.

-What about high school students who are not Christians, yet want to attend ORU? They are welcome, and though not required to be believers, must sign the honor code. They will not be singled out, but experience has shown the effectiveness of positive peer pressure and the influence of chapel, chaplains, RAs, etc.

-Providing more study spaces for students? We are aware of the need. Improvements have been made to the "fishbowl". The new library and dorms will have excellent study spaces. Also, the enrollment team is considering how to market ORU to introverts, making it a place of peace and for study.

-ORU response to gender identity issues? The Board has approved a white paper on Human Sexuality which articulates the official position of the university. New faculty are required to agree with this position, and all faculty are to be guided by this stance in the classroom. We believe this is the scriptural position, yet it is also important to show individuals the love of Christ and be sensitive.

Provost's Report: Dr. Reid-Martinez

At the November 21, 2022 meeting of the Academic Council, college representatives received updates from the Registrar, voted on Gen Ed Committee proposals, discussed potential punctuality challenges with an expanding campus, and sought more information on platforms to support class scheduling and other academic activities.

The following were proposed by the General Education Committee and approved by the Academic Council:

-COSE 2022-79 and GEN 357, Environmental Ethics (Scaffolded Interdisciplinary Course).

-Revised General Education Outcomes.

Regarding updating advisor lists—the Registrar's office currently supports a weekly manual update at the department level. They will collaborate with IT to see if this can be automated.

The Academic Council requested the Registrar's Office to provide additional demonstration and review of Coursedog or similar platforms to streamline academic procedures such as curriculum change workflows, evaluation of related deadlines and ORU catalog management.

The report was accepted by unanimous vote after a motion and second.
