

SUPERVISOR'S SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT FOR NEEDLESTICKS & SHARPS INJURIES

Risk Management

Because of federal and state regulations with regard to blood borne pathogens, additional information must be provided whenever an employee receives an injury arising from the use or accidental exposure to medical or laboratory devices, such as hypodermic needles, scalpels, etc. Supervisors and managers of any employees injured by such devices are responsible for obtaining and reporting the following information, in addition to providing the regular injury/illness reporting forms.

Employees who have been exposed to potentially infectious and/or hazardous materials should seek treatment within two (2) hours of the exposure. Post-exposure evaluation and follow-up protocols for HIV, HBV, and other infectious diseases will be determined at the time of treatment.
