Founded in 1965, ORU is a private, residential Christian University with a commitment to a Whole Person Education. Our resolve to create a powerful student experience spanning academics, campus life, extracurricular pursuits and faith yields highly sought-after graduates. These graduates are thoroughly prepared academically, possess vision and character and are primed to truly make a difference across our world today.



A WHOLE PERSON EDUCATION

The Whole Person Education is about personal formation. Learning both broadly and deeply across disciplines gives our students the tools they need to undertake the challenges of their chosen field. By including physical and spiritual components alongside academics, our education process becomes elevated to whole person transformation.

EXCEPTIONAL FACULTY

With a student/faculty ratio of 15:1, the ongoing personal interaction between students and faculty is part of what makes ORU a powerful place of learning. Our faculty fosters a family atmosphere through mentoring, individual attention, open-door policies and a commitment to student learning.

235 faculty members spread among six colleges: Arts and Cultural Studies; Business; Education; Nursing; Science and Engineering; Theology and Ministry.

50% of undergraduate faculty and 100 percent of graduate faculty hold terminal degrees.

CHRISTIAN WORLDVIEW

Christian worldview permeates every aspect of ORU life. From classroom to dorm room and chapel to athletics, our campus is spiritually active. We welcome students of all denominations to our Christ-centered community life. In addition, we have chapel services twice weekly, practical ministries, small-group weekly devotions and on-campus, student-led activities like prayer initiatives and worship services.

HEALTHY LIFESTYLE

ORU's whole person approach to education incorporates physical fitness as a way of life for our students. Aerobic activity not only improves physical health, but also has a positive effect on brain function.

The ORU Aerobics Center features

- Fitness studio
- Four racquetball courts
- Six-lane Olympic-size swimming pool with diving platforms

Intramural sports include: basketball, soccer, volleyball, tennis, racquetball, frisbee, ping pong and dodgeball, to name a few.

LIFE-CHANGING EXPERIENCES = REAL-LIFE PREPARATION

A broader understanding of the world around you helps you better understand how to serve in it. Through both academics and missions, ORU offers a wide range of opportunities to see that world through new eyes: study abroad, local and international internships, mission trips, leadership opportunities and more.

ORU graduates with a GPA of 3.6 or better boast a medical school acceptance rate of **86%**. Our graduates have attended more than 80 medical schools. Students in the ORU honors program have had a **100%** acceptance rate into medical schools over the past five years. We have a **90%** acceptance rate into law school, **93%** pass rate on the National Council Licensure Examination for registered nurses, and are in the **89th** percentile on the National Field Test for business graduates. In addition, **100%** of recent engineering graduates were employed with an average starting salary of \$65,000.

ORU graduates have landed careers at companies such as:

ABC, CBS, NBC, CNN, CBN, Amazon, Conoco-Phillips, DreamWorks, Industrial Light and Magic, Mercy Ships, ONEOK, Society of Exploration and Geophysicists, The Williams Company and World Compassion.

FINANCIAL AID

Currently, over **93%** of full time undergraduate students enrolled in an on-campus degree program receive some form of institutional aid. Additionally, we participate in state and federal aid programs, which offer qualifying students grants, scholarships, work-study jobs and government loans.

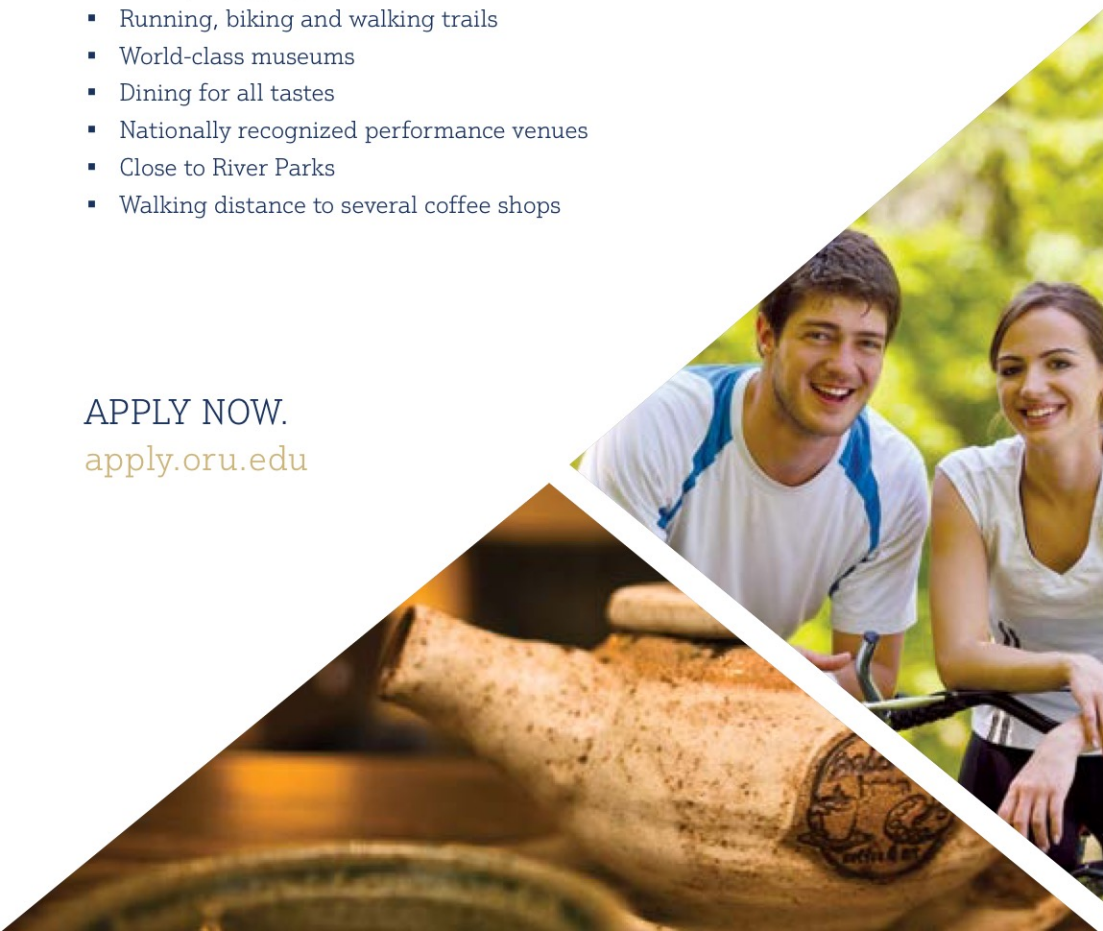
