FURTHERING THE TRADITION OF ROMANTIC PIANO

Known as the "Pianist to the Presidents," David Osborne's credentials are many, with a list of White House performances that include the Reagan, Bush and Clinton administrations, and Osborne created and organized President Carter's 75th birthday tribute in 1999. Carter has said that "David is one of the finest pianists in the United States." President Bush said, "That boy can play!"

Osborne performs currently at his new home, the Bellagio Hotel and Casino in Las Vegas, Nevada. Before that, he spent twelve years as a fixture at Caesar's Palace. His music styles include romantic, classical, jazz, pop, inspirational, patriotic, and Broadway show tunes, and he's recorded 22 albums, with total sales near five million units. His latest recording, Simply Romantic, is currently available at Hallmark Gold Crown Stores.

Born and raised in Miami, Oklahoma, he received his undergraduate degree from Oral Roberts University. At Indiana University, he studied classical pipe organ and piano performance, with a minor in French. At Pittsburg State University, he completed a master's degree in keyboard performance and music composition.

A few of Osborne's more significant recent events include an interview and performance on TV's "The 700 Club," a concert for the Steinway and Sons International convention of worldwide dealers at the Beverly Hills Hotel, a benefit concert at the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, New York, and a performance in Las Vegas, playing the Steinway pianos of Vladimir Horowitz, Van Cliburn and George Gershwin.
